

The Program

- In operation since 1998
- How does it work?
 - United State Department of Transportation (USDOT) and Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) funding
 - Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) management
 - South Florida Commuter Services (SFCS) outreach
 - ♥ VPSI, Inc. operation
- Program is based on a lease agreement
 - ⋄ 30-day lease agreement
 - ♦ Insurance included (no-deductible)
 - Maintenance included (scheduled and non-scheduled)
 - A \$400 subsidy per van per month

Did you know what the preferred van size is?


- 7- passenger van 77%

The monthly passenger cost depends on the size of the van and the total mileage traveled. This average cost ranges from \$60 to \$80 per month.

_ The Region

- 1998: The program started as a Demonstration Project for Miami-Dade residents or workers.
- 2002: Broward joined the program.
- 2004: Palm Beach joined the program.

The Future

- In June 2005, FDOT hired the consultant firm of Urban Trans, Inc. to study the next steps for the program.
- The study is almost completed and provides information on the following:
 - ✓ Alternate operating, management and funding options
 - ✓ An evaluation between leasing and purchasing the vehicles
 - ✓ Pros and cons for the users of the various options

Study Preliminary Highlights:

- The draft study is recommending continuing with the existing leasing approach.
- The draft study is also recommending transferring the program to the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (SFRTA).
- Create a formal Vanpool Advisory Board to provide advice and recommendations related to program policy.

Pending Issues:

- Clarification of the funding sources to be used in the future.
- If SFRTA is selected, funding needs to be allocated for cost of managing the program. Currently, Miami-Dade MPO is authorized to use \$20,000/year for this purpose.
- Preparation of an Intergovernmental Agreement or a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) among the three (3) MPOs, FDOT Districts 4 and 6, and SFRTA.
- 🦴 Submittal of the Final Draft Report.
- Presentation to each MPO Board for approval.
