You, as a Miami-Dade County resident, can and should play a significant role in this planning process.

ABOUT THE PLAN

The purpose of the Miami-Dade Transportation Plan to the Year 2025 is to guide federal, state and local transportation expenditures between now and the year 2025. The plan will include highway, transit, bicycle and pedestrian improvements.

MIAMI-DADE METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION (MPO)

Keeping Our Community on the Move

The Federal government requires that every major metropolitan area in the country create a long-range plan for addressing the projected transportation needs of the community. This plan must take into consideration a full range of issues, including the short- and long-term impacts on the existing transportation system of growth, land use and development; economic, social and environmental concerns; and equally important, the availability of limited public and private funding.

As Federally designated, the MPO is charged with the responsibility for planning the development of the overall transportation system for Miami-Dade County. Working with state, regional and local agencies staffed by land use planners, environmental and aviation experts, civil engineers and transportation professionals, the MPO produces a long-range plan that guides transportation-related development and prioritizes candidate projects for at least the next 20 years. Every three years this plan is updated based on the community's changing needs, and through workshops, open forums and hearings, the public is invited to provide input. Check out the draft Plan on the MPO's website and offer your comments and input.
