


Existing Configuration

- Refinish crosswalk design
- Install additional Ligustrum trees where currently missing
- Add Date Palms in selective locations to balance existing tree pattern
- Replace the palm trees within the sidewalks with new palms - Foxtail or Alexander
- Repaint existing light fixtures
- Replace aging landscape bed shrubs
- Perform routine watering and use of tree fertilizers
- Trim and shape existing Ligustrum trees
- Power wash sidewalks




- Prepare and formalize right-of-way easements to align the roadway and provide adequate space for pedestrian use

- Replicate the current crosswalk patterns
- Install trolley stop shelters and pavement designation
- Install additional shade, palm, and flowering trees






CRA Map - City of Homestead
